

Highest Ever Sixth Form Results at Bishop Vaughan Catholic School

Excitement and celebration were evident at Bishop Vaughan on A-Level Results Day as overjoyed students collected some truly outstanding results! Bishop Vaughan's Sixth Formers were delighted to learn that they had achieved the school's highest ever outcomes in both Year 12 and Year 13.



Year 12 pupils beamed as they opened their envelopes, which collectively represented the highest ever percentage of A grades, doubling the pleasing outcomes seen last year. A total of 18 pupils in Year 12 swept the board with A grades across all of their AS subjects, with two pupils, Alvin Saji and Ethan Fage, achieving 100% in every one of their examinations. Ethan Fage stated, 'Bishop Vaughan has been incredibly supportive. I am so happy and could not have asked for anything more. The teachers have supported me every step of the way and I couldn't have done this without the help I have had from family, friends and staff.'

Year 13 pupils were also thrilled, as nearly half of all grades received were A* and A grades. Almost 90% of all Level 3 entries achieved A*-C grades and the overall pass rate was exceptionally high at over 99%. All pupils choosing to take up degree studies were successful in securing a place in a university and course of their choice.
